I. Athletic Plan

- a. The Athletic Director will conduct all team meetings. In the initial team meeting the following will be discussed.
 - i. Hazing
 1. Mr. Sherwood updated the SCC on the recent hazing concerns. He also discussed additional trainings that will take place next year.
 - ii. Financial Practices
 - iii. Fundraising Guidelines
 1. All fundraisers need school and district approval.
 2. A cost analysis for each sport will be outlined and handed out to parents before the season starts.
 - iv. Sportsmanship
 1. The idea of a region sportsmanship trophy was brought up and will be discussed with the region board.
 - v. Code of Conduct
 1. Proper interaction with parents, media, etc.
 2. Parents, coaches, and participants will sign a JHS Code of Conduct

- II. 8th/9th grade transition
 - a. Orientation Day (August 16th)
 - i. All 9th and 10th graders will come to school for the full day on August 16th .
 - ii. Morning assembly. Send the students to each class for approx.. 24 minutes/8 period day.
 - iii. Parents are welcome to come to the school on the 16th .
 - b. Transition Committee
 - c. Optional Activities (dances, intramural sports, etc.)
 - i. Should an optional activity be provided for students during the dances and other activities that the 9th graders may not feel comfortable participating in?
 - d. Academic Supports (tracker, credit recovery, etc.)
 - i. The student advocate will find the 9th graders that are not attending or failing classes. This will decrease the number of future dropouts
 - ii. Free credit recovery during the day. Students can go to a lab and pass a class by meeting the standards of the course. Students can earn credit in the online learning lab as well as make up credit they are deficient in.
