- 1) Welcome Randy Johnson

- 2) Review of Last Month's Minutes Randy Johnson
Moted and approved.

- 3) Update on Emergency Situations Wendy Dau
 - Information about incident two Fridays ago.
 - Safe Schools violation - Suspension pending investigation
 - District level hearing
 - No threat whatsoever
 - Worked with district personnel to get information to parents and students
 - Student was cited for Class B Misdemeanor
 - Wendy addressed emergency situations in latest assembly
 - Have students talk to parents, administrators, police if feeling unsafe or feel that someone is being threatened.
 - Community concerned that school knew about threat for 3 days.
 - Alert community of process that occurs during an emergency - protocols that happen when school gets a safe school threat.
 - **Action Item:** Wendy will send updates to parents via Skyalert as to what happens when there is a threat to school safety.

- 4) Land Trust Budget Update Wendy Dau
 - 2 to 3 months behind on payroll
 - Can carry over 20000
 - 15,000 in equipment will be gone
 - link crew - 5000 for teacher training - Melissa Baker
 - 15 chromebook carts need to be replaced next year
 - Motion to use money for chromebook carts
 - Motion approved to use monies for chromebook cart as per stated in Trust Lands Budget which states that excess can be used to purchase chromebooks and other necessary technology.

- 5) Data for Current CSIP and Land Trust Wendy Dau
 - ELD being paid for out of Lands Trust
 - ELD move quickly through WIDA levels, but not doing as well in SAGE testing.
 - Reading data is not showing progress
 - Reading intervention classes- should advance 100 points - our average growth rate is 10
 - 1 problem - Curriculum is not appropriate for high school
 - Difficult not having a full time-part time teacher that only teachers reading.
 - Serving 29 students in reading - 337 students who are not proficient
 - Paying for Study Skills Class
 - Hit and miss with results
 - If SCC chooses to fund Study Skills, the class needs a scripted curriculum
 - AVID - 7 sections

- Make sure money is being tied to really clear data points.
- EWS - Decline in student performance as the year goes on.
 - Compared longitudinal data 2017 to 2018 quarters 1 and 2.
 - Struggling with attendance here at Jordan
 - Considered a chronically absent school
 - F's and D's students have decreased - focus made by teacher and admin
 - Making gains with Sped, low income, and ELLs.
 - GPA - only group that went down was ELL - all other groups improved
 - Something similar to Business Leadership Class at CTEC to help with attendance
 - No longer very strict truancy laws
 - Any ideas from SCC about how to improve attendance would be greatly appreciated by the administration. Administration reviewed the incentives we were already have tried to improve attendance

6) Tentative Proposals for CSIP and Land Trust

a. Priorities for 2018-2019 School Year

- Increase graduation rate by an additional 1 %
 - Track that with quarterly data
 - Track D's and F's quarterly and compare with previous year data
 - Reading is problematic
 - Increase number of students on grade level reading
 - Increase lexile score by at least 100 points if in a reading class
 - Enroll students in READ 180 - research based reading intervention program
 - 20 kids in a class - 10 in adaptive program - 10 small group instruction
 - Enroll students with greater than 1000 lexile then place them in math intervention
 - Chromebook carts for ELD
 - Expand sections for ELD classes - need 6 sections for next year
 - Provide PD for teachers
- School Climate Goal
 - Ask more questions about connection to school - students - Climate Survey
 - Increase attendance by a certain percent
 - 500 students have taken school climate survey
 - Going to provide for information on school climate
 - Herriman High - Aide who meets with students in yellow (at-risk) category - Track attendance and make goals.
 - Link Crew for freshman -not sure how effective that is for student attendance
 - Could help with connectedness
 - Going to meet with Link Cre Advisor about adjustments that can be made to improve program
 - Take Elective Credit for Link Crew Leaders - Criteria that need to be met
 - Letter for Link Crew - Service Letter
 - Have link leaders talking to students who are in the yellow and red.
 - Been paying for an Intervention Specialist
 - Goes and makes home visits
 - Protocols need to be developed that trigger home visit when student is in the yellow

- b. Feedback from all SCC Members
 - \$214000 is approx distribution
 - \$234000 approx budget for next year
 - FTE is dropping by at least 2.5 full teachers
 - Reading Sections: we will need at least 7
 - Cost of teacher plus 1 period is 83000 with benefits
 - Cost to distribute sections to different teachers cost is 56000
 - Read 180 Program - 200 Licenses
 - \$95000 (could be paid for out of textbooks; we could use some Trust Lands to help finance it)
 - Attendance Tracker - 10,000
 - Math Lab - Ustar Money
 - Chromebook Carts - 3 to 5
 - Link Crew Sections - 8000 each
 - Link Crew Trainings - 5000
 - .5 FTE For Social Worker
 - Can only pay for teachers out of FTE, Lands Trust, AP, Concurrent
 - Haven't seen much done with Link Crew
 - Leaders aren't connecting with students as much as they should be.
 - Service Leaders - finding students and connecting with them - students at lunch, EWS
 - Semesterized class - Link Crew
 - Use Clubs - Service; could we create a Service Letter??
 - Renee Herman Reading Method
 - 80% of students who receive D's and F's are attending everyday.
 - Seek out ideas from other schools that have better attendance.
 - Scholarships for students - SB General
