- 1) Welcome Randy Johnson

- 2) Review and Approval of February Minutes Randy Johnson  
Motion, second to approve February Minutes
  
- 3) Review of Trust Lands Budget for 2017-2018 Wendy Dau
  - 18,000 will decrease from current amount for next several months
  - Purchasing 10 hot spots for library check out
  - Purchasing 2 chromebook labs
  - Purchasing replacement chromebooks
  
- 4) 2018-2019 School Improvement Plan Goals Wendy Dau
  - Over 20% of students have attendance issues
  - Keep same goals
    - Increase graduation rate
    - Track D's and F's compare longitudinal data
  - Attendance is big issue - tied to school climate
  - Currently using 80.813 teachers
    - Given 75.5 teachers
    - School Trust Lands, Concurrent Enrollment, and AP Testing are pools of money where FTE can be taken from
    - .25 from AP and .25 from CE
    - District provided an additional .625 FTE
    - 2.75 out of Trust lands gives 79.375 - would make a slight reduction in FTE for 18-19
    - Can possibly pull .25 from CE if absolutely necessary.
    - 4 Sections for Reading (.625)
    - 6 Sections for Eld - pay for 4 Sections from Trust Lands
    - 6 Avid Sections ( 1 FTE)
    - Start with 80 licenses now, for READ 180 purchase rest next year with textbook monies
      - 20 students for each Class for Reading
    - Consider looking for Volunteers to help as Reading Tutor or ELD Tutor
    - Paying a paraprofessional is cheaper than having teachers work on their prep periods
    - Latino in Action students utilized as ELD tutors

- Attendance Tracker - 17.5 - May be able to cover without having to hire someone.
  - .5 FTE for social worker - helps with attendance- completes home visits
  - Every school had a reduction in FTE
  - Members can come by and sign before day.
- 5) 2018-2019 Trust Lands Discussion Randy Johnson & SCC Members
- SCC members expressed that funds should be put towards FTE to ensure that teachers were not transferred out of the school and that additional supports were being provided to students.
  - It was noted that by paying for interventions and special academic programs (i.e. AVID) through Trust Lands preserved electives for all students.
  - Motion to approve Trust Lands Budget. Seconded. Unanimously approved by members who were present.
- 6) Summer Credit Recovery Wendy Dau
- Running an AVID summer transition again this summer
  - Adding a Reading component
    - Incentives will still be in place
  - Summer Credit Recovery in final stages with a teacher
    - 16 Hour Intensive Course within 1 week - will earn .25 credit
    - Working off No grades will be a possibility
    - After Spring Break is when students will start being invited
    - More info coming in April
    - 116 Freshmen are already credit deficient
    - Enrolling 20 kids in a course will pay for itself
    - Scholarships available for students who can't afford the cost
    - \$35 per quarter credit
- 7) Counseling Update Melissa Baker
- Starting Sophomore CCR's next week
  - Parents received letters this week
  - Meet with students as a group and then individually to discuss credits and plans for future
  - 1.5 counselor was reduced by FTE
  - Looking to use funds to pay for .5 counselor which would pay for an intern.
  - Please encourage community to utilize resources - counselors, psychologists, and social workers at school
